| Administrative/ Biographical Sketch | <p>James Anderson (1838?-1923) was born Perthshire, Scotland. In 1863 he was lured by the gold rush to Cariboo. While unsuccessful at gold mining his claim to fame were the poems and narratives he published and presented as part of the Cariboo Amateur Dramatic Association. James Anderson left the Cariboo in November, 1871 and returned to Scotland.
